## Principal's Greeting

Final Schedule—On January 27 and 28 (last)

Greetings, Spartan Parents,

**Levy narrowly fails (probably) ... our response-** As I write this, the "count" shows the School District's request for renewal of the property tax levy to fund additional operation costs and purchase textbooks is narrowly failing-- 15,141 to 15,214. If the levy fails, clearly the school board must discern what voters are saying and then take steps to address the concerns raised by "no" voters, while at the same time meeting the huge needs of students in the district. Please give board members your input.

As for us at CHS, we will be advocating for: 1) Looking closely at building and district expenditures and spending priorities. We may need to shift money to classrooms and teachers, away from other very important, but less vital areas. 2) Going back to community members with a clearer message—"The levy will go to the classroom needs, including textbooks. Without it, we will see class sizes growing out of sight (36-38 at CHS) or critical important programs will be cut (I won't even start down that road—those cuts will require more input and thinking from the broad community)."

**Extended Learning, Extended Application (value) (examples)-** CHS and the District are always focusing on improving learning. One obvious method to help students learn, and retain what they learn, is to "extend" their learning from the material presented in the classroom, to a context outside the classroom. Studying about our justice system in a government text is important, but sitting in a Mock Trial exercise, or watching an actual court proceeding, "extends" the learning and will help the student really understand and remember. Fifteen CHS teachers used part of their summer vacation this year to develop class units aimed at such extensions. With the help and guidance of Brian Flannery, District Extended Learning Coordinator, they are putting that work into effect this year. We know good teachers have always used opportunities to extend learning, and we hope that this work will build on and improve that effort.

**Building update--** 1. No construction hang-ups; 2. Good weather has allowed for most of the roof to be installed and a great deal of interior work to be well under way; 3. The design is really taking shape and we're still excited and proud—the school feels very functional, comfortable and inviting; 4. We're still ahead of schedule and making contingency plans for moving in either in December or in August next year, depending on how building progresses. No promises!! 5. Inconveniences will occur when we ask classes in both the Tech Ed (Shop) and the FACS (Family/Consumer) areas to vacate their classrooms around Winter break and Spring break to allow workers to get an early start on major remodeling. We're very sorry, but believe we can make it all work with the help and understanding of students and teachers.

**Spartan Way-** Our focus on improving attendance, hallway behavior, respect and cleanliness is showing positive results. Absences have been cut, attendance calls are coming in within the 48-hour rule and students are getting the message that they need to be in class in order to make progress. Student dress is still quite expressive and diverse, but our basic "lines" for appropriate dress have been overwhelmingly accepted by students and staff—with a few reminders and judgment calls needed every once in a while. Thank you to students, staff and parents for helping make CHS a safe, respectful place to live and learn.

**Thank you to parents** who have stepped up and helped us in so many ways. For our new Automotive Repair class--seven "older" cars to work on, pickup loads of used parts, engine hoists, and various small work tools for example. For our Woods program—truckloads of lumber from contractors and mills (small pieces, not long boards, at that, but very useable). Activities classes have received outright purchases of uniforms and equipment. We received boxes of copy paper, class sets of novels, new equipment for computers, gift certificates, and plain cash\$\$\$\$. Equally valuable is the tremendous amount of parent volunteer time—taking tickets at games, holding football down markers, selling refreshments, counseling college bound seniors and taking on students as interns or job shadows, to name a few.

## Flu Season Information

Parents – the flu season is upon us and the Center for Disease Control has provided some guidelines so we might avoid getting ill:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick, too.

- If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.
- Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose or mouth.

Students with a temperature of 100 degrees or higher must be sent home. Please make sure your student has a back-up plan if you are not available to transport them.

## Attendance Caller Information

Parents and guardians at CHS have long appreciated the convenience of our attendance caller. Each school day this

machine dials a parent or guardian's specified phone number and plays a taped message whenever a student misses even one class period. Parents or guardians can then call the school and excuse the absence, if that is appropriate, or ask questions of their student.

Recently, however, we have noticed a flaw in our system. For those phones where a code has to be entered to leave a message or where blocked, those parents and guardians will not be able to rely upon the absence caller for daily attendance information. If you would like to change the number that the caller dials so that you will be able to receive these calls, please contact our registrar at 757-5884.

## Beyond CHS News

### Financial Aid Night

Financial Aid Night will be held jointly with Philomath High School at PHS on Tuesday, December 7, from 6:30-8:00 PM. Parents, especially those who are sending their student to college for the first time, are encouraged to attend this excellent session. The Assistant Director of Financial Aid from Western Oregon University will make the presentation.

### FAFSA

Parents and students who are planning to file FAFSA in January will need pin numbers. You may apply for the pin numbers now at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). Remember, you are going to be filing for 2005-2006 using this year's taxes. You cannot file until after January 1, but you can get the pin numbers now, just don't lose them! FAFSA applications will be available in Beyond CHS in December.

### SAT's for Juniors – from Nancy

Juniors should start signing up for the March, May and June SAT's at [collegeboard.com](http://collegeboard.com). This is a longer test than previously because it has a writing section now, so students should plan on the test (along with instructions) taking approximately 5 to 5-1/2 hours. We will review with the juniors information on college and tests that need to be completed, probably in February. I recommend that students take the SAT twice in the spring, and then also take SAT II's in the spring if they are completing a subject like US History or French 4 or Pre-Calculus. Scheduling can be a concern.

The goal is to get as much done in the spring of the Junior year so that the fall of the Senior year can be devoted to college applications. Students should put the high school code for CHS on their registration form, which is 380-210. This is important because we then get labels that are put on the transcript and you do not have to pay collegeboard to have the scores sent. The colleges will accept them because they are on the official transcript.

### ACT for Juniors – from Nancy

If I could have one wish for the Juniors, it would be that they all sign up for the ACT. The ACT is a curriculum based test that is accepted in lieu of SAT's, with the exception of a few schools like Cal Tech. Students, especially those that study for tests, seem to

do better on this exam and it keeps options open for students applying to college as well as individual college scholarships. Go to [www.ACT.org](http://www.ACT.org) and choose the writing option with the test. That way, everything is covered.

### PSAT

Results from the PSAT will be given to the students during a lunch time after they have been returned to us. We probably will not receive them until the third week of December or the first week of January. Be sure to check with your student and ask to see the results. They will be given back their test booklet along with the answer sheet. This will be a good resource that the students can use to improve their SAT's.

## NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY INDUCTION at CHS

Corvallis High School officials will induct 91 sophomores, juniors, and seniors into National Honor Society (NHS) on Tuesday November 23rd. The ceremony, which is free and open to the public, will take place from 7:00-8:30 PM in the school auditorium.

Several criteria are considered for NHS membership. Students who attain an accumulative GPA of 3.6 through the previous semester receive letters inviting them to apply for membership. The application includes questions about student involvement with school and community activities that demonstrate leadership, service, scholarship, and character. After applications are received, teachers of each candidate confidentially rate him or her in each of those four areas. The final step involves a confidential panel of five teachers who review each application and make an admission decision.

NHS membership affords the student the opportunity to develop strong leadership skills through service to their school and community. Students perform much volunteer school and community service.

Inductees will receive an award certificate, membership card and may purchase a pin. Membership is also reflected on students' transcripts. As long as students maintain their GPA and standards of membership, they are NHS members for their high school career.

CHS Principal Jay Conroy will deliver the welcoming speech and will introduce Superintendent, Dr. Jim Ford. A variety of Faculty speakers will also be speaking on the characteristics of NHS, those being leadership, service, scholarship and character.

NHS executive council students will conduct the ceremony. They are Ben Jay and Colin Shear, Co-Presidents; Adam Cole, Vice-President; Alicia Zook, Secretary; Michael Beilstein, Treasurer; and David Zeller, Historian.
