Dear Parents,

Construction update— It is appropriate that as the school year winds down, we give you a final update on the construction of our new facilities. The last few pieces that had been delayed by winter weather are being finished over the next 60 days. They include: 1) construction of the replacement batting cage for softball and baseball (on the west side of 16th St.); 2) the stadium including press-box, upgraded track surface, landscaping, ticket booths, and storage; 3) the softball field/ general practice field off of 11th street; 4) wrapping the 'overflow' basin between the new softball field and the main parking lot with retaining wall and sidewalks/ramps; 5) new cyclone fencing and fan-entrance for the Taylor field baseball and softball areas along 16th and Buchanan Streets; 6) exterior painting—including the Tech buildings and metal support beams on the main building; and 7) final landscaping for the new softball field and Tech Ed areas.

We are waiting for School Board decisions regarding completing of our sight, including number and placement of tennis courts, placement of a JV/FR grade baseball field and upgrade to the existing softball field area.

We can't express enough our thanks to district staff, including Fred Wright and members of the maintenance staff who have helped us wrap up final adjustments and details. It's been a huge undertaking by staff, students and community and the final product is truly a great place for our students and community to gather to learn and play.

School Climate— Students are settling into the building and new routines and expectations. Staff and students are working hard to set a positive environment that is safe and respectful. As spring arrives one area we are emphasizing is **respectful dress expectations**. We have set the following as reasonable standards for students and appreciate your support in helping students meet them.

"Generally—CHS recognizes the right to free expression and the value of diversity, including diversity in dress and general appearance. We also recognize the right to a non-disruptive, safe and healthy educational environment that prepares students for next steps. Staff will enforce student dress expectations to ensure a safe and accepting classroom environment that is comfortable for students and staff.

Specifically—to give clear positive guidance the following are appropriate: Clothing that covers the midriff, cleavage and backside; baggy pants, clothes with sports team logos, flip-flops and frayed clothing that are otherwise appropriate; tops with spaghetti or thin straps.

The following items are not appropriate for school activities: Tube, halter, backless or strapless tops or shirts with large underarm openings; clothing or accessories with suggestive writing or pictures related to sex, drugs, alcohol or tobacco, gangs, violence, vulgarity or ridicule of a particular person or group; clothing with holes in inappropriate places; pants or shorts that intentionally "sagged" or clothing that exposes undergarments or that may cause, in the judgment of a school official, a disruption. Footwear must be worn at all times."

Thank you to staff who are leaving who have worked so hard for CHS students and community. We are deeply indebted to the care, guidance and support given by the following members of our CHS community- Marianne Wilcox, Lang. Arts (retiring); Blou Carman, Language Arts (retiring); Joyce Wahl (assistant principal (retiring); Beth Russell, Language Arts (professional leave); Eric Pittenger, Science (retiring); Tony Vandermeer, Social Studies (new position); Michael Morris, Social Studies (resigning); Linda Alderman, Office Administrative Assistant (new position). Our best wishes to them all in their new ventures.

We are busy hiring for these vacancies with the commitment that we are looking for the very best teachers and staff that we can find to assure that CHS continues to provide a great positive educational experience for all of our students. We look forward to welcoming new faces to our CHS community.

Thanks to all of you for your support of CHS. Keep your notes and comments coming. We sincerely appreciate the input.

Memorabilia Picture Collages

Remember all the things that your senior has done? The activities that have kept you busy? All those photos, posters and programs that you have collected over the years? Now is the time to bring all these memories together for you and your senior to enjoy.

How to prepare your collage:

1. Gather a collection of photos such as your senior at different ages; maybe include snapshots that also show your senior with other classmates. You could also include portions from posters or programs from sporting, music and drama events, dances, news articles, etc.
2. Arrange the materials horizontally on a sheet of 11" x 17" paper. No larger please. You don't need to cut up your photos, just "stick" them to your base paper with a dab of glue or two sided tape. The items can overlap with each other, and can extend a bit beyond the edge of the paper (the extension will not be photocopied). The best part about the collages will be the opportunity for your student and his/her classmates to reflect on their "history". Have fun, and don't worry about being the "most" creative!
3. Prepare 1 to 2 maximum collages.
4. Take your collage(s) to your favorite print shop, and request that a color copy be made. Be sure to make extra copies to keep for yourself or to send to family and friends. The following stores do color copying: Henderson's, Staples, Office Max, Kinko's, Mailboxes Etc. and Paperworks Design. The cost for color copying will probably be around \$1.75 each. Laminating costs will be around \$4. each. Please laminate your collage(s) before turning them in.
5. Place your student's name on the FRONT of the collage(s). On the BACK, print your student's name, address, phone number, school, and graduation year. This is important for identification purposes. (Return your photos to your albums or shoebox collection!)
6. Deliver your collage(s) to your student's high school office by May 23rd. We will arrange the display for the party. After the party, the collages will not be returned and will be stored for display at the ten year reunion!

Summer School 2006

All of our regular and credit recovery online courses are available to students on a tuition basis. The courses are available through **COOLSchool and Corvallis Online**. Costs vary by program. If course is dropped within 2 weeks of registration, tuition will be refunded, less a \$40 processing fee. To register, a check must accompany the summer registration form and sent or delivered to Laurie Corliss at the District Office (1555 SW 35th Street Corvallis, OR 97333).

CoolSchool Regular Courses Last day to register for these is June 9th. (We can delay their actual start date until June 19th if desired.)

Cost per course is \$275 when paid through the school district. (Check made out to Corvallis School District) (\$295 if the parent wants to register their student online and pay using a credit card)

CoolSchool 6-Week Credit Recovery Courses Registration period is June 1st through June 12th. (Courses run from June 12th to July 21st)

Cost per credit recovery course is \$175 when paid through the school district. (Check made out to Corvallis School District) (\$190 if the parent wants to register their student online and pay using a credit card)

Corvallis Online Courses Register anytime between now and last day of school.

Cost per course is \$190. (Check made out to Corvallis School District)

Courses available:

Health 1, Health 2, Personal Psychology, American History 1 & 2, International Studies 1 & 2, Creative Writing 1 & 2, Journalism. Students are allowed 18 weeks to complete the course, but are strongly encouraged to finish during the summer or some time in September at the latest.

Remember, these students will not have the benefit of Kathleen Muravez (CHS) and Frances Brennan (CVHS) to help guide them and keep them on a reasonable pace for completion. Please consider not only the student's work habits but also their fall schedule if they anticipate extending the work into September. It is entirely possible to complete these courses in a two-month time frame, but it may require the student to spend at least an hour a day on their course, and in some cases more than that.

All guests must be registered in the main office by the host student by the established deadline. The person inviting the guest will share responsibility for the conduct of the guests. Anyone leaving before the official end of the activity will not be readmitted. Breathalyzers may be used for students suspected of alcohol use.

Getting Cleared for High School Sports

It is not too soon to begin preparing for next year's fall sports season. Conditioning week begins on Monday, August 14 (optional) and official practice will begin on Monday, August 21st. To start practice on August 21st, you must first be cleared for sports in the Athletic Office during the period between Wednesday, August 16th and Friday, August 18th. Each athlete must:

- Read and sign the code of conduct (with parents); includes academic requirements, training rules and citizenship expectations.
- Have a sports physical if a freshman or junior (also, sophomores and seniors if no physical is on file from the previous year).
- Everyone must complete a health history/emergency information form yearly
- Complete either A or B of the travel permission form
- Pay an athletic user fee - TBD
- Carry medical insurance and purchase a student body card at school registration
