Dear Parents:

Course Registration—Students will receive material Tuesday, April 03, 2007, in their advisor groups to enable them to register for classes for next year. They have one week to sit down and review (hopefully, with you, too) their needs—what do they need to graduate, what do they need to be ready for “next steps” (college, community college, work). Please take time to read through the course catalogue with your student to make sure you understand the alternatives for your student. Those materials are **due back to CHS the week of April 10** with your signature of approval.

Some key points to consider: 1) If you’re headed for college, be sure to plan for entrance requirements—two years of second language; math at the Alg. II level; and more; 2) We have 56 opportunities in four years to earn 46 credits required for graduation. Most students take about 51 credits. Spread out the tough classes (especially during the junior year), consider taking one or two of them in the senior year when students typically have more flexibility; 3) Explore areas of interest—personal interest or career interest, and consider taking that class Pass/No Pass if you’re worried about “not being very good” at that area; 4) Ask questions of your advisor and your counselor and your teachers. They will have some great insights about what might work best or not for you.

Budget—We are pulling together our building budget for next year and welcome input (directly or by email) from parents as to the wisest use of our building allocations. With our enrollment remaining at about 1335 and with passage of the local option levy, we know that we will be receiving additional monies to hire new staff in Language Arts, Social Studies, Math and Science. We will also be using part of our allocation to increase department supply budgets by about 50% from last year’s figures—note, last year’s supply figures were about 15% of the level of supply funding 10 years ago. We also need to direct some of our building dollars towards a joint Alternative-Education program funded by CV and CHS for students who need a more structured placement than we can provide at CHS. Finally, we have received money for a part-time staff position aimed at helping students at CHS who are dropping classes or who are struggling with attendance. Rather than being outside of a class, these students will be brought under guidance and supervision of a staff member, helping them turn around and be successful.

Personnel—The district building administrators each year at this time work with district office personnel to address staffing needs for the coming year. Transfers, retirements, leave requests and staff departures are all pulled together, along with proposed staff adjustments under our new budget. We will finalize those positions by Mid-April, but we are already looking for positions that we know we will need. At least one of our building administrators attend regional teacher-candidate job fairs (four scheduled so far) and we actively seek out and meet with interested teachers who are looking to move to the area. The goal is clear—find and retain the very best staff possible. In our May newsletter we will have final details of openings for next year and may even have announcements of selections we hope to have made by then.

New Principal search—A committee of CHS staff, parents and students has been working closely with district office representatives interviewing a second round of candidates for the principal’s position. Candidates met with the staff before spring break and the names of finalists have been forwarded from the committee to Superintendent Tarzian for her final review the week of April 2nd.

Conferences—we encourage all parents to take advantage of the upcoming conference days, set for Thursday and Friday, April 12 and 13. This is a great opportunity to listen for ways you can support your student. There are appointment times available on Thursday from noon to 4:30 PM and on Friday, from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. General open drop-in times will be on Thursday, from 5:30 to 8:00 PM. All conferences are to be held in the cafeteria area in order to help parents move quickly from one teacher to the next.

How to prepare your collage(s) - 2 maximum:

1. Gather a collection of photos of your senior at different ages; include snapshots that show your senior with other classmates. You could also include clips from posters/programs from sporting, music dance and drama events.
2. Arrange the materials horizontally on a sheet of **11" x 17" paper**. No larger please. You don't need to cut up your photos, just "stick" them to your base paper with a dab of glue or two sided tape. The items can overlap with each other, and can extend a bit beyond the edge of the paper (the extension will not be photocopied).
3. Take your collage(s) to a print shop, and request that a color copy be made. Be sure to make extra copies to keep for yourself or to send to family and friends. The following stores do color copying: Henderson's, Staples, Office Max, and Kinko's. Please laminate your collage(s) before turning them in.
4. Place your student's name on the **FRONT** of the collage(s). On the **BACK**, print your student's name, address, phone number, school, and graduation year. This is important for identification purposes. (Return your photos to your albums or shoebox collection!)
5. Deliver your collage(s) to your student's high school office by **May 21**. We will arrange the display for the party. After the party, the collages will **not** be returned and will be stored for display at the ten year reunion!

June 11 - Mandatory graduation practice at Gill—usually at 10:00 or so.

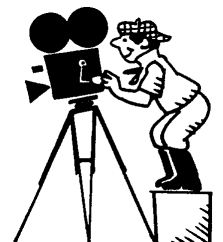

AP Exams

Beyond CHS will begin registering students for the AP exams beginning Monday, February 5 – March 22. We will only offer the tests listed below. The nonrefundable deposit is \$15 payable to CHS. We ask that you not send the full amount because many students change their mind and it is difficult to refund the balance. The total cost of each exam will be \$93 and the balance will be due by May 1. There are two physics tests at the AP level at \$93 each however, we will reduce the second exam in physics to \$70. They will have to pay two deposits. If your student is on free or reduced lunch, please have them see me. All AM exams will begin at 7:30 (before school starts) and all PM exams will begin at 12:00, room locations will be announced later.

Speech and Debate Team to National Championships!

A team of high school students from the Corvallis Speech and Debate Team traveled to Portland March 8-10 to compete in the Oregon State Speech and Debate Championships. First place honors in Public Debate were taken by **Ben Lykins** and **Zac Bentley**, with Bentley also placing second in Radio Commentary.

The following weekend the team traveled to Ashland for the Southern District National Championship Qualifier, with outstanding results. Qualifying for the National Championships were **Alyssa Vincent-Hill** in Lincoln-Douglas Value Debate and **Zac Bentley** in Foreign Extemporaneous Speaking. Also qualifying for Nationals were **Emily Plotkin**, and the team of **Frazier Bleeker** and **Ben Lykins** as 2nd Alternates. **Vincent-Hill** and **Bentley** will represent Corvallis at the Nationals in Wichita, Kansas in June, competing against the best high school debaters in the nation.

These events continued a successful debate season that consisted of tournaments throughout Oregon. The team is coached by **Danielle Robertson**, Forensics Director for the Corvallis School District.

As members of the National Forensics League (NFL), Corvallis team members compete in a variety of debate and public speaking events, preparing their presentations based on extensive research, and honing their skills in twice-weekly practice sessions. NFL events included in competitions are: Policy Debate, Lincoln-Douglas Debate, Legislative Debate, Public Forum (Ted Turner) Debate, Extemporaneous Speaking, Original Oratory, Dramatic Interpretation, Humorous Interpretation, Duo Interpretation, Commentary, and Impromptu Speaking.

Next Year Class Registration

Registration for the 2007-'08 school year will begin on Tuesday, April 3 and registration sheets with **ALL the required signatures** will be due the following **Tuesday, April 10**. Ask your students to see the course catalog for all of the exciting classes and help them choose wisely.

1. Our schedule is built to meet the needs of your pre-registrion choices. Please choose the classes wisely. This is the **ONLY** opportunity to make course requests. It will not be possible to honor teacher or time of day preferences. Schedule changes will not be granted unless there are errors. Please **PRINT** clearly!
2. Refer to the Course Catalog for required courses, descriptions, college prep information and graduation requirements.
3. All classes requiring teacher approval and an initial will have a clear box beside it.
4. Count the credits that you have circled. You should have 14 credits.
5. You will be given your 1st choice if at all possible. However, if your 1st choice will not fit into your schedule it is important that you list 4-6 alternatives to provide an opportunity for a complete schedule. Failure to list alternatives may mean you will be placed in alternatives that will fit best (if necessary) and you will not be able to change.

Attendance

Reminder, Parents/Guardians; PLEASE make arrangements with your son or daughter concerning doctor appointments, and all other appts. prior to school hours. Our student body consists of approximately 1,350 students. Our policy is to not interrupt class time to give students "reminders" for appts. and such. This interruption during instructional time can be frustrating to the teacher. All notes will be put on their lockers, unless it is an emergency. Please ask your son and/or daughter to check their lockers periodically.

CHS needs your help in reporting absences. If your child has been or will be absent, please call the CHS Attendance Office at 757-5888 as soon as possible. If you do not call, the computer will record your child's absence as unexcused. After 48 hours, absences cannot be excused. Notes are not accepted in place of a phone call.

Absences may be excused at the request of a student's parent/guardian because of illness, disability, illness in the immediate family requiring the student's presence, a family emergency, religious reasons or anything the school deems appropriate (up to 5 pre-arranged absences per semester). Students who are eighteen years old may request their own absences be excused.

Encourage your child to attend all classes; but if a class is missed, clear excused absences in a timely fashion by calling to give the exact date of absence, clock or period of absence and please spell the student's last name clearly.

Do you still get a phone call from the "Automated" call system? - even AFTER you have called the Attendance line to excuse your student? Please be aware that when you have called to excuse your student from being absent for a certain period class, your student still may have missed another class the same day, in which the Automated phone system will dial out for the class that is left unexcused.

An "Attendance Record" is posted outside of the Attendance Office. This record shows the student's attendance for the previous day and current day. If you receive an "Automated" telephone call stating that your student has missed one or more classes, please have your student check the attendance record to see which teacher marked them absent. If this was an error the student and teacher can resolve it.

Guidelines for Student Visitors
