College-Bound Juniors Summer Tasks: There is plenty that students can do this summer to prepare for the college application process next fall. Use the CIS System to begin or continue your college search and to identify career interests; visit college campuses - get information about the school; look at college applications to see the types of essay questions asked; draft some essays -- you'll be surprised how this will save you time next fall; identify some people you would like to use as references; if you're planning to take SAT or ACT tests in the fall, register now; update your resume; and, check out books from the CC for the summer.
